At the annual meeting of Gustav Adolph Lodge No. 230, Duetscher Order of Harugari, held this week, the following principal officers were installed. - Carl Schneider

June 6, 1877

The selectmen have granted first-class licenses to the following persons to sell liquor in the Town of Montague: Chas. Schneider, K Street. All these are in Turners Falls, and pay \$100 each.

January 9, 1878

The following officers were installed in Gustav Adolph Lodge, D.O.H., by August Fix, G.B. of Boston, this week: Charles Schneider

July 9, 1879

Gustav Adolph Lodge, D.O.H., installed these new officers, Saturday: Treasurer, Carl Schneider;

November 2, 1881

The following is the democratic town committee for the ensuing year: D.F. Ripley, Chairman; M. Keefe, Carl Schneider, J.G. Eppler, Samuel Goodnow and Jason Mann.

April 19, 1882

First Class - To sell liquors of any kind to be drunk on the premises. Carl Schneider - Dwelling House, owned and occupied by him on K Street, Turners Falls

June 13, 1883

Charles Schneider has bought valuable machinery for the manufacture of soda and all other aerated waters, which he will put up in large quantities at his bottling establishment on K Street.

March 18, 1884

Charles Schneider is going into the bottling business more extensively than ever this year, and making better goods than usually sold will supply most of the hotels and dealers in the county. His manager, Henry Picking, is an unusually industrious young fellow, and will make the business a success.

Charles Schneider is preparing to "busy season" his soda water factory.

March 20, 1901



Frank Prondecki, proprietor of the New City market on Fourth Street, has sold out to Karpenski & Kopkoh, who took possession last week. Mr. Prondecki will devote his time to his Bottling business.¹

Turners Falls–Louis E. Sicard, 65, former local assessor, and fo many years a resident and businessman here dies at 3:45 a.m. yesterday at the Glens Falls, N.Y. hospital from burns received a week ago when an oil burner over-heated in his home.

After attending the local public schools, he became associated with his father in the shoe business on Avenue. A and later ran the business himself. He sold the shoe store to engage in the manufacture of soda pop under the name of the Franklin Bottling Works, now owned by. Mrs. Czeslawa Prondecki. Some years ago, he moved to Green Pond near Lake Pleasant and began development of the site. For many years, this proved to be an attractive and popular swimming and recreation spot. He was a Ford salesman at one time, and was also engaged in the painting and tile setting business.
